## **ISIT Consultants**

## **Professional Approach**

## **The Process**

Carrying off a successful operation with the greatest chances for positive long-term results depends on a meticulous professional process that begins with identifying the various roots of the problem. Careful implementation of this first stage is what helps turn a security budget into a well-spent investment for the good of the community rather than being wasted on "putting out fires."

The process in all its stages:



1. Locating the factor/s threatening security on the community and individual levels.
2. Defining special and at-risk population groups in order to chart a long-term handling process.
3. Conducting an in-depth study of existing professional and operational preventative methods in order to pinpoint weak spots.
4. Preparing a long-term plan of operation that relates to the relevant players and incorporates elements of the integrative security setup.
5. Implementing the plan by starting the projects, training personnel, and adapting professional and technological tools for successful utilization while matching tools to personnel needs and levels of ability.
6. Adapting the activity to new and/or changing conditions such as new social phenomena or new modi operandi used by the adversary (crime, terrorism, etc.)

### **Unique Crime Prevention Projects**

Carried out in close cooperation with the Israel Foreign Ministry's Center for International Cooperation (Mashav) and The International Institute Ltd., these projects are aimed at a mixed population starting with representatives from the political echelons, the community and the security forces, through the special-needs population (high-risk, juvenile delinquents, prisoners, etc.). The projects are varied and may be defined along with the relevant local factors.

## **Operational Doctrine Development**

The Department of Operational Doctrine Development is responsible for updating and matching the operational activities of the various customer units to the customer's ever-changing security needs, as the enemy constantly updates and varies its modes of operation and technological capabilities.

The department's professional activity is based on the ISIT Group's holistic approach of integrating all the operational components at its disposal, including custom designing a training program in cooperation with the Israel Security and Crime-prevention Academy.

### **Operational Krav-Maga (OKM)**

The Krav Maga (KM) method was founded by Imi Sde-Or (Lichtenfeld) soon after the establishment of the State of Israel, based on the principles of simple, natural and effective movements. The original Krav-Maga philosophy was based on adjusting the different technique levels to the trainee's physical and psychological characteristics. Over the years, as the method developed and expanded on an international level, it drifted away from some of these principles.

Operational Krav-Maga, developed by Gabi Shai, adapts various KM and survival techniques to the specific operational needs of different security units by integrating the basic principles in situations of ever-changing tactics. OKM is also a unique training method that builds up the trainee's combat ability. Gabi Shai has developed OKM courses for the Israel government's special security units; and in recent years the method has been made available to the public by OKM expert Aaron Laurent Elbaz, using specific OKM skills and techniques tailored to the level of personal self-defense.

### **Principles of OKM**

1. Adapting and applying KM and other martial arts techniques to the operational needs of various units according to the type, nature and location of the activity.
2. OKM as a means of training security personnel or soldiers to carry out their mission effectively and not become a target themselves
3. Learning and drilling simple techniques that can effectively be used even after a long period without formal training.
4. Learning most of the techniques based on instinctive reactions.
5. Decisive, swift responses to gain the competitive edge over the enemy.
6. Drilling realistic surprise situations "as close as possible to reality."
7. Training under stress and in states of physical and mental exhaustion, combined with elements of recognition and decision-making.
8. Learning according to principles of response rather than predefined exercises.
9. The use of different levels of controlled aggression as the situation demands.
